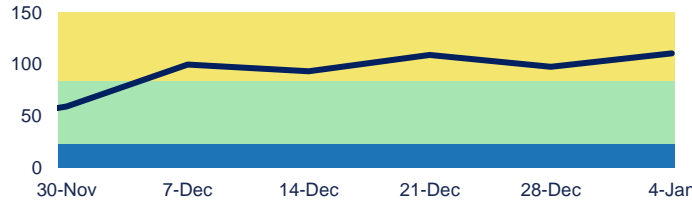

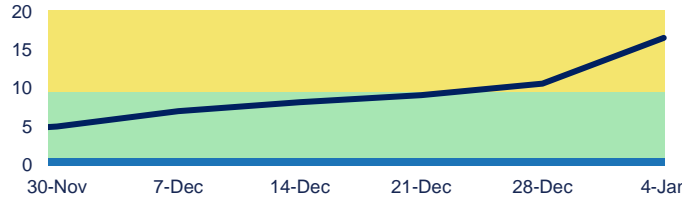

COVID Hospital Admissions per 100k (7-day total)

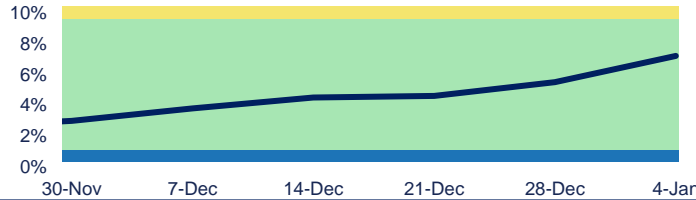

CDC Community Level and Recommendations

- ✓ If you are high risk for severe disease, consider wearing a mask, have a plan for rapid, and talk to your medical provider about treatments

- ✓ Stay up to date with COVID-19 vaccines and boosters

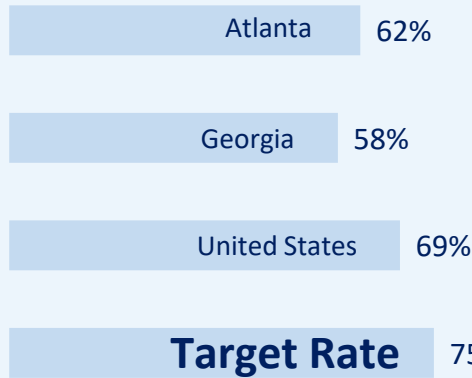
